Where language learning becomes connection



What it is

Entwin-ed is an after-school enrichment program that connects students in New York learning Spanish with students in Madrid learning English through a shared, bilingual arts-based project. Across eight weeks, students engage with current exhibitions and cultural themes in their cities, using art as a starting point for inquiry, dialogue, and collaboration. They develop their language skills while creating a meaningful project together.

What it offers

- Tailored language development (intermediate to advanced)
- Inquiry through the arts across both cities
- Structured support for collaborative creation
- Continuous guidance throughout the program

How it works

We Ask — We explore a real-world question inspired by a current exhibition of cultural theme found in both cities.

We Reflect — Students research and interpret the topic from their city's perspective.

We Build Together — Students co-create a bilingual, creative project through collaboration and dialogue.

We Share — Projects culminate in a public or semi-public presentation, giving students an authentic voice.

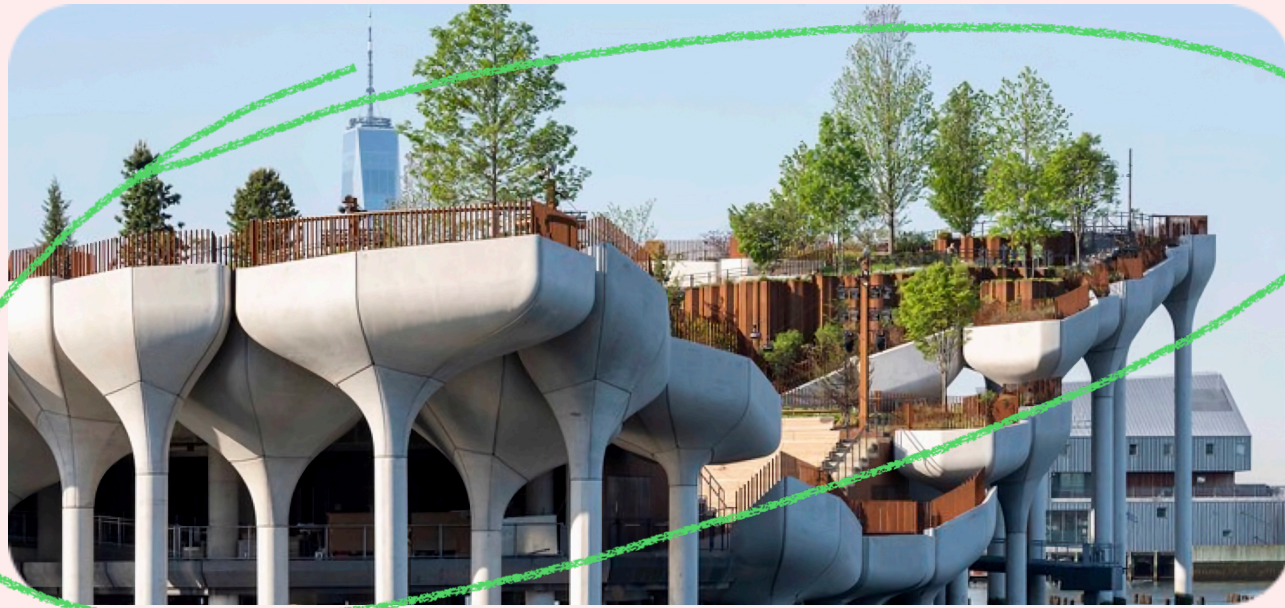

Frequently Asked Questions

Who is this program for?

Students aged 14–16 with an intermediate to advanced level of English or Spanish.

How are students paired?

Students are carefully matched with a partner in the other city based on age, interests, and language level.

What level of language is required?

Students should feel comfortable holding a basic conversation and expressing ideas, even if not perfectly.

How do students communicate?

Through weekly guided sessions and structured exchanges, supported by their facilitator.

Who leads the sessions?

All sessions are led by an experienced language educator and supported through a structured, small-group format.

What is the time commitment?

Two weekly sessions:

- One 30-minute session with the facilitator
- One 40-minute session with the city partner

Plus individual time in exploring art in the city

Will sessions be recorded?

Some sessions may be recorded for educational purposes only. All recordings are handled with care and respect for student privacy.

How is student data protected?

All personal data and recordings are used exclusively for educational purposes and handled in accordance with data protection regulations.

How many students are in the program?

The pilot is limited to a small group (maximum 8 students) to ensure a personalized experience.

Marta Ferrer, PhD, is a language educator and curriculum designer specialising in arts-based learning. She trained as a Teaching Fellow at Columbia University, where she taught Spanish through interdisciplinary approaches integrating art and culture, often working with students in museums across New York.
